TECHNICAL GUIDELINES BOXING

OVERVIEW



HOST CITY MONTERIA CORDOBA COLOMBIA: Montería, the capital city of the Department of Córdoba, is located in the northwestern part of the country, within Colombia's Caribbean region. Situated on the banks of the Sinú River—hence its nickname “Pearl of the Sinú”—it is also known as the “Cattle Capital of Colombia.” The city has a total population of 527,436 inhabitants and an average temperature ranging from 28°C to 32°C.

Montería is a cultural city recognized for its traditional folk dances such as cumbia, porro, and fandango, as well as for its handicrafts made from natural fibers, such as the iconic sombrero vueltiao. It is home to major national events such as the corralejas and the National Cattle Fair, both of significant importance in Colombia.

PARTICIPANTS' DECLARATION

General Regulations – Art. 29 When submitting their registration, participants in the JEDECAC shall sign the following declaration: “I hereby declare, on my honor, that I will respect the Statutes of CONCECADE, the General Regulations of the Central American and Caribbean School Sports Games, the Competition Rules, and all other provisions of the Games, committing myself to participate under the principles of Fair Play, applying my utmost effort and technical skills.”

COMPETITION DAYS: November 6–9, 2025

TECHNICAL INFORMATION MEETING: November 4, 2025

REGULATIONS: The General Regulations of the JEDECAC, as well as the current *World Boxing* regulations, will apply.

CATEGORY:

The athletes' age must comply with the provisions of Article 28 of the General Regulations of the JEDECAC. The upper age limit will be 17 years (U-17) as of the year of the competition, while the lower age limit will be 15 years, provided they fall within the corresponding weight division.

DELEGATION QUOTAS:

ATHLETES	Up to 13 female athletes
	Up to 13 male athletes
COACHES	Up to three (3) coaches
DELEGATE	One (1)

- ❖ Each country may register a maximum of one (1) athlete per weight division.
- ❖ Each country may register one (1) coach if they have 1–3 athletes, two (2) coaches if they have 4–5 athletes, and up to three (3) coaches if they have six (6) or more athletes registered.
- ❖ For an event to be official and eligible for medal awards, at least three (3) athletes from different countries must be registered in that weight division.

COMPETITION SYSTEM & TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS:

The competition will follow a Single Elimination format, in accordance with World Boxing regulations.

BOUT SCORING:

The scoring system approved by World Boxing will be used.

BOUT DURATION:

As stipulated in the technical and competition regulations of World Boxing, both male and female bouts will consist of three (3) rounds of two (2) minutes each, with one (1) minute of rest between rounds.

GENERAL WEIGH-IN & MEDICAL EXAMINATION:

- Date and location will be announced in advance or during the technical meeting by the Organizing Committee.
- Requirements: Record book, accreditation, medical certificate endorsed by CONCECADE's Technical Commission, and "no-pregnancy" test (for females).
- All athletes must present medical test results as per *World Boxing* standards.

Daily weigh-in and medical exam: 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. on all competition days.

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DRAW:

The draw will be conducted using an electronic system, operated by a qualified individual designated by the Colombian Boxing Federation.

COMPETITION OFFICIALS:

All technical officials, judges, and referees participating in JEDECAC will be appointed by the Colombian Boxing Federation.

COMPETITION AREA CONTROL:

Only individuals accredited by the Organizing Committee will be allowed in the competition and weigh-in areas.

Only regulation footwear is permitted in these areas.

Athletes will only access the competition area during their bout and must leave immediately afterwards.

UNIFORMS:

Athletes must wear a shirt covering the chest and back, and shorts above the knees, in compliance with World Boxing regulations.

OFFICIAL EQUIPMENT:

10-ounce gloves and headgear approved by *World Boxing* will be used.

AWARDS:

- Athletes must be in full national uniform for the awards ceremony.
- Medals per event:
 - **1st place:** Gold medal
 - **2nd place:** Silver medal
 - **3rd place:** Bronze medal (awarded to both third-place finishers)

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- A trophy will be awarded to the top three countries in the overall standings, based on the total number of gold medals won across both genders.

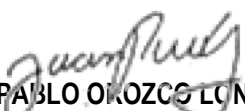
PROTESTS & CLAIMS:

- **Article 39 – Eligibility:** Protests regarding an athlete's eligibility prior to the start of the Games will be resolved by the JEDECAC Technical Committee of the respective sport. Protests must be signed by the Head of Mission, Deputy Head of Mission, or the sport delegate.
- To verify eligibility, delegations must present athletes' original passports at the technical meetings. All Heads of Mission will have access to these documents.
- **Article 40 – Appeals:** The Organizing Committee (CO) and the CONCECADE Technical Commission (CT-CONCECADE) will appoint a First Instance Appeals Tribunal for each sport to address and resolve protests within the respective discipline.
- This tribunal will be composed of three (3) members: the sport's technical coordinator and two representatives from participating countries, elected during the technical meeting.
