TECHNICAL GUIDELINES TAEKWONDO

OVERVIEW



HOST CITY MONTERIA CORDOBA COLOMBIA: Montería, the capital city of the Department of Córdoba, is located in the northwestern part of the country, within Colombia's Caribbean region. Situated on the banks of the Sinú River—hence its nickname “Pearl of the Sinú”—it is also known as the “Cattle Capital of Colombia.” The city has a total population of 527,436 inhabitants and an average temperature ranging from 28°C to 32°C.

Montería is a cultural city recognized for its traditional folk dances such as cumbia, porro, and fandango, as well as for its handicrafts made from natural fibers, such as the iconic sombrero vueltiao. It is home to major national events such as the corralejas and the National Cattle Fair, both of significant importance in Colombia.

PARTICIPANTS' DECLARATION

General Regulations – Art. 29 When submitting their registration, participants in the JEDECAC shall sign the following declaration: “I hereby declare, on my honor, that I will respect the Statutes of CONCECADE, the General Regulations of the Central American and Caribbean School Sports Games, the Competition Rules, and all other provisions of the Games, committing myself to participate under the principles of Fair Play, applying my utmost effort and technical skills.”

TECHNICAL INFORMATION MEETING: November 1, 2025

REGULATIONS: The General Regulations of the JEDECAC will apply, as well as the current regulations of the World Taekwondo Federation (WTF).

CATEGORY:

The age of the athletes shall be as established in Article 28 of the JEDECAC General Regulations. The upper age limit is 17 years as of the year of the competition, while the lower age limit is 15 years as of the year of the competition.

- ❖ Each country may register a maximum of one (1) athlete per Kyorugui (sparring) event and up to four (4) athletes in Poomsae (forms), according to the scheduled events.
- ❖ An athlete may compete in both disciplines.
- ❖ For an event to be official and count towards the medal standings, at least three (3) athletes or teams from different countries must be registered in that event.

COMPETITION SYSTEM AND TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

KYORUGUI (Sparring):

- a) The competition will be single elimination and two (2) third places will be awarded.
- b) Matches will be contested using the best-of-three (3) rounds system (Article 7 of the current Kyorugui Regulations), with a one (1) minute rest period between rounds.

POOMSAE (Forms) – Competition Method:

- a) Recognized Poomsae pairs and Freestyle Poomsae (individual and pairs) will use a cut-off system.
- b) Recognized Poomsae individual (male and female) will use a single elimination system.
- c) Designation of recognized Poomsae as per regulations.
- d) As stated in Article 8 of the current WT Competition Rules.
- e) Taeguk 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, Koryo, Keumgang, and Taebaek.
- f) Duration: as stated in Article 10 of the current WT Competition Rules.

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- g) Recognized Poomsae – maximum 90 seconds.
- h) Freestyle Poomsae – between 90 and 100 seconds.
- i) Drawing of lots for starting order and assigned Poomsae.
- j) As stated in Article 11 of the current WT Competition Rules.
- k) During the Technical Congress, the draw for recognized Poomsae and the starting order for recognized and freestyle events will be conducted.

COMPETITION AREA CONTROL

Only persons duly accredited by the Organizing Committee will be allowed access to the competition and weigh-in areas. Athletes may enter the competition area only during their match and must leave immediately afterward.

AWARDS

All athletes must wear their national team uniform during the awards ceremony.

Medals will be awarded for each tournament in each discipline and scheduled event as follows:

1st place: Gold medal

2nd place: Silver medal

3rd place: Bronze medal to both third-place athletes

PROTESTS AND CLAIMS

Article 39 – Eligibility: Protests regarding an athlete's eligibility prior to the start of the Games will be resolved by the JEDECAC Technical Committee of the respective sport. Protests must be signed by the Head of Mission, Deputy Head of Mission, or the sport delegate.

To verify eligibility, delegations must present athletes' original passports at the technical meetings. All Heads of Mission will have access to these documents.

Article 40 – Appeals: The Organizing Committee (CO) and the CONCECADE Technical Commission (CT-CONCECADE) will appoint a First Instance Appeals Tribunal for each sport to address and resolve protests within the respective discipline.

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This tribunal will be composed of three (3) members: the sport's technical coordinator and two representatives from participating countries, elected during the technical meeting.

TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Any matters not provided for in this document shall be resolved by the JEDECAC Organizing Technical Commission.
