TECHNICAL GUIDELINES VOLLEYBALL

OVERVIEW



HOST CITY MONTERIA CORDOBA COLOMBIA: Montería, the capital city of the Department of Córdoba, is located in the northwestern part of the country, within Colombia's Caribbean region. Situated on the banks of the Sinú River—hence its nickname “Pearl of the Sinú”—it is also known as the “Cattle Capital of Colombia.” The city has a total population of 527,436 inhabitants and an average temperature ranging from 28°C to 32°C.

Montería is a cultural city recognized for its traditional folk dances such as cumbia, porro, and fandango, as well as for its handicrafts made from natural fibers, such as the iconic sombrero vueltiao. It is home to major national events such as the corralejas and the National Cattle Fair, both of significant importance in Colombia.

PARTICIPANTS' DECLARATION

General Regulations – Art. 29 When submitting their registration, participants in the JEDECAC shall sign the following declaration: “I hereby declare, on my honor, that I will respect the Statutes of CONCECADE, the General Regulations of the Central American and Caribbean School Sports Games, the Competition Rules, and all other provisions of the Games, committing myself to participate under the principles of Fair Play, applying my utmost effort and technical skills.”

COMPETITION DAYS:

Women's: November 1–5, 2025

Men's: November 5–9, 2025

TECHNICAL MEETING:

Women's: November 1, 2025

Men's: November 4, 2025

REGULATIONS:

The General Regulations of the JEDECAC will apply, as well as the FIVB International Volleyball Rules.

CATEGORY:

Athletes' age must comply with Article 28 of the JEDECAC General Regulations:

Maximum age: 17 years old during the year of competition.

Minimum age: 15 years old during the year of competition.

DELEGATION QUOTAS

COACHES PER TEAM	Up to four (4) coaches
DELEGATE	One (1)

- ❖ Each country may register 1 team per gender.
- ❖ Each team must have two sets of uniforms (one light-colored and one dark-colored).
- ❖ For the competition to be official and count toward the medal table, at least 3 teams from different countries must be registered.
- ❖ Teams may be reinforced with up to two (2) players who do not belong to the same educational institution, in accordance with Article 27 (paragraph b.1) of the JEDECAC General Regulations.

COMPETITION SYSTEM & TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

The competition system will depend on the number of teams registered:

- Three (3) teams: Round-robin, double round. Final standings determined by total points earned.
- Four (4) to six (6) teams: Single round-robin. Top 4 teams advance to semifinals (1st vs 4th, 2nd vs 3rd). Winners play for 1st place, losers for 3rd place.
- Seven (7) to ten (10) teams: Two groups. Single round-robin within each group. Group winners play for 1st place; second-place teams play for 3rd place.
- Eleven (11) or more teams: Groups of 3 or 4 teams. Single round-robin within groups. Top 4 teams advance to cross semifinals; winners play for 1st place, losers for 3rd place.
- The host country's Technical Coordination may adjust the schedule to ensure a suitable number of matches. Final adjustments will be made after the Nominal Registration deadline.
- All matches will be best-of-five sets, except medal matches (1st and 3rd place in both genders), which will also be best-of-five sets.
- Points allocation:
 - ❖ Win 3-0: 3 points
 - ❖ Win 3-1: 3 points
 - ❖ Win 3-2: 2 points
 - ❖ Loss 2-3: 1 point

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- ❖ Loss 0–3: 0 points
- ❖ Loss by forfeit: 0 points
- 8. Tie-break criteria:
 - ❖ Set ratio (sets won / sets lost)
 - ❖ Point ratio (points scored / points conceded)
 - ❖ Head-to-head result
 - ❖ Drawing of lots
- 9. Only in the first match of each day will a 15-minute grace period be allowed. After that, teams not present will lose by forfeit.

Uniforms: Must comply with FIVB International Volleyball Rules (non-approved brands are allowed).

Each team must have two uniforms in different colors.

AWARDS

By team:

1st place: Gold medal & trophy

2nd place: Silver medal & trophy

3rd place: Bronze medal & trophy

Individual skill awards (both genders):

1. Best Server
2. Best Receiver
3. Best Setter
4. Best Attacker
5. Best Blocker
6. Best Defender
7. Best Libero

Country ranking awards:

- ❖ Trophy & gold medals to the 1st-place country

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- ❖ Trophy & silver medals to the 2nd-place country
- ❖ Trophy & bronze medals to the 3rd-place country

PROTESTS AND CLAIMS

Article 39 – Eligibility: Protests regarding an athlete's eligibility prior to the start of the Games will be resolved by the JEDECAC Technical Committee of the respective sport. Protests must be signed by the Head of Mission, Deputy Head of Mission, or the sport delegate.

To verify eligibility, delegations must present athletes' original passports at the technical meetings. All Heads of Mission will have access to these documents.

Article 40 – Appeals: The Organizing Committee (CO) and the CONCECADE Technical Commission (CT-CONCECADE) will appoint a First Instance Appeals Tribunal for each sport to address and resolve protests within the respective discipline.

This tribunal will be composed of three (3) members: the sport's technical coordinator and two representatives from participating countries, elected during the technical meeting.

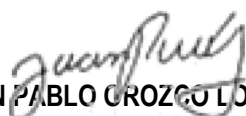
TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS
